CHAIRMAN CAROLE ROBERTSON WRITES -

The Village Summer Fair in July was a most successful event, enjoyed by all who attended judging from the kind comments. Unfortunately however, when preparing the Village Green, arguably the very heart of our community, an unpleasant fact came to light; the green is used as a rubbish dump by people using its facilities.

I personally picked up two large carrier bags of plastic bottles, beer cans, sandwich wrappers, sweet wrappers and general waste. Some items were dumped only a couple feet from a waste bin. The worst abuse was that the area under the trees at the front of the green was also being used as a urinal as well as a dump for beer cans and fast food containers.

It costs the Parish Council a lot of money to provide litter bins and have them emptied. That money comes from local residents through the precept. There are many far better things to spend it on than clearing up thoughtlessly discarded litter.

Please, we urge you put litter in the bins or take it home with you and encourage your friends and family to do the same. Littering carries a fixed penalty fine of between £50 and £150 and the Council are looking into getting more litter wardens to patrol the worst areas in Ferring.

REMEMBRANCE DAY - The annual act of Remembrance organised by Ferring Parish Council and our local Ferring Churches will be held on **Sunday 11th November 2018.** The Parish Family Service in St Andrew's Church will commence at 09.30am and will end at approximately 10.30am. The Laying of Wreaths at the War Memorial in Ferring Street will take place after the service at 11.00am and will include the Act of Remembrance. **PLEASE NOTE** - part of Sea Lane will be closed during the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial. Advance warning notices will be posted around the village.



FERRING REMEMBERS - This year marks 100 years since the end of the First World War and it was felt that it would be right for this to be recognised. Ferring will be staging events on 9th, 10th and 11th November. It is hoped that these will include a film night, a Concert/Supper Party and of course the traditional service in Church and at the Memorial. ARUN LOCAL PLAN - Arun District Council adopted the Arun Local Plan (2011-2031) at their Full Council Meeting on 18th July 2018.



KEEP FERRING TIDY - The Parish Council have been made aware of an increasing problem with litter and dog fouling within various locations of the village including on the Glebelands Recreation Ground, the Village Green and the beach. There are numerous litter and dog bins located around the village. It is an offence to drop litter or allow your dog to foul.

Please 'pick up' and dispose in the correct bins provided around the village. Thank you for helping to keep Ferring tidy.



LOVE WEST SUSSEX MOBILE APP - This is a West Sussex County Council Mobile Application. Residents can report environmental issues such as highways matters including potholes, damage to street furniture or fly-tipping through their mobile phones; West Sussex County Council will manage and respond using their integrated services. These matters can also be reported on the West Sussex County Council website.



PANTILES - The ownership of the small piece of grassed land in front of the Pantiles in South Ferring has now been transferred to the Parish Council. The land will remain a green space for the public to enjoy.



WILD FLOWERS - Can we encourage all residents to visit the display of wild flowers on Little Twitten and the Village Green, kindly planted by Arun District Council this year.



OVERGROWN HEDGES & BOUNDARIES - This is a polite request to residents to ensure that their garden plants and vegetation are kept in good order and hedges are cut back to their original boundaries and not causing any danger or obstruction to other residents, as we have an increasing number of residents coming into the office to highlight such issues. This is with a particular emphasis at corners of 'T' junctions and cross roads and edges of public footpaths.



PLANNING NEWS - Updates on a couple of recent planning applications:

Planning application FG/66/18, 78 Langbury Lane, Part change of use for western half of building from Residential Care Home (C2 Residential Institution) to residents living together as a single household (C3(b) Dwelling House) was approved by Development Control 11th July.

Planning application FG/27/18/PL, 58 Ferringham Lane, Demolition of care home and redevelopment to provide for apartment building for seven self-contained flats, cycle parking, bin storage and car parking has been approved with conditions.
