Ferring Parish Council – Spring 2019 Village News & Views from your Council

CHAIRMAN CAROLE ROBERTSON WRITES -

Shortly the annual Council Tax notification will be dropping through letterboxes. Part of this charge is made up of a local precept set by Ferring Parish Council and collected on our behalf by Arun District Council.

Ferring Parish Council sets its precept for the upcoming financial year in January. The precept provides the vast majority of the councils' income for the year and enables us to maintain and enhance the village environment and provides for the day to day running cost of the Parish Council.

At the Parish Council meeting on 14th January, it was agreed that we would set a precept amount of £91,000. This represents a 2.4% increase on the total for 2018 - 2019. However as there have been a considerable number of new houses built and occupied over the last 12 months the actual increase for householders is a much smaller percentage, as more people are paying. This has resulted in a 1.15% increase for a Band D council tax payer in 2019 - 2020. In monetary terms, this means that Band D council tax will rise by 43p a year, from £37.50 to £37.93.

FERRING VILLAGE GREEN – In the last Parish Flyer, we advised that the Parish Council is currently working in conjunction with Arun District Council (ADC) to improve the appearance of the Village Green frontage. The work has now started; ADC has removed one tree, cut the ivy on the trees and pruned the hedge around the noticeboard area. Further works will include clearing the various shrubby undergrowth and spraying to minimise regrowth, grass seeding the cleared area and planting appropriate bulbs, making a short pathway through the middle of the area to the main part of the village green and continuing the knee rail fence along this area.

DOG ISSUES – It has come to the attention of Ferring Parish Council once more that the issue of dog nuisance on the beach and along Patterson's walk has worsened considerably.

Dog excrement can cause some extremely dangerous conditions including toxocariasis, a potentially lethal disease carried in dog faeces which can also cause blindness.

Arun District Council has the sole legal power to make orders controlling or banning dogs on the beach or any other open space.

Unfortunately, the Parish Council cannot act beyond its authority but we completely understand the views of residents who find the presence of uncontrolled dogs frightening and a potential health hazard particularly for children and vulnerable elderly people.

In 2016, ADC organised a Public Space Protection Order Consultation for dogs on leads on Patterson's Walk and the beach between April and September. Unfortunately, the order was not granted. The Parish Council has recently asked ADC to conduct another consultation but they have declined on the basis that there have been so few complaints/concerns received.

In order to assist all other areas, there are four grit bins, the east end of Langbury Lane, north entrance to the village green, north Greystoke Road and outside the convenience store south Ferring. The salt is provided for residents use for public areas only.
