The laying of Wreaths at the War Memorial in Ferring Street will take place after the service at 11.00am and will include the Act of Remembrance. If your village group or organisation would like to order and lay a wreath, please contact the Parish Office. **PLEASE NOTE** - part of Sea Lane will be closed during the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial. Advance warning notices will be posted around the village.

GUIDES - 1st Ferring Guides have had another wonderful couple of terms, being out and about in Ferring; replanting our boat planter on the Green (feel free to water if you're passing this summer!), undertaking a litter picking challenge in the park, enjoying the Village Fair where we sold refreshments, amongst all of our other meeting activities - rock-climbing, creating (delicious?!) mocktails, a mini cookout and paddle at the beach, and our now traditional family rounders game. It's lovely to report that after reopening 1st Ferring Guides a couple of years ago, with a handful of members, we continue to grow - Guiding is going strong in Ferring!


GLEBELANDS PROJECT GROUP - You may be aware that Ferring Parish Council (FPC) has been offered an option to purchase the Glebelands Centre from West Sussex County Council (WSCC). This could be valuable in securing the facility for Ferring residents.

In order for FPC to determine whether this is viable the Parish Council has set up a Project Group to research potential options.
