**REMEMBRANCE DAY –** The annual act of Remembrance organised by Ferring Parish Council and our local Ferring Churches will be held on **Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2022.** The Parish Family Service in St Andrew's Church will commence at 09.30am and will end at approximately 10.30am. The laying of Wreaths at the War Memorial in Ferring Street will take place after the service at 11.00am and will include the Act of Remembrance. If your village group or organisation (if you do not already) would like to order and lay a wreath, please contact the Parish Office. **PLEASE NOTE** - part of Sea Lane will be closed during the laying of wreaths at the War Memorial. Advance warning notices will be posted around the village.

**FREE EVENT ORGANISED BY FERRING VILLAGE HALL TRUSTEES –** Crime Prevention talk focusing on Digital / Online safety by Claudia Deamer of WSCC at Ferring Village Hall on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at 2.00pm. It is a free event, but tickets are required, which can be obtained either from the Parish Council Office, or from the Village Market on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September 10:00am to 11:00am.



ACTIVE PLAY SUMMER SESSIONS – Following the success of the 'out and about' project in previous years, Ferring Parish Council arranged for Freedom Leisure to return to the village with the project this summer. The project provides free weekly activities for youngsters on the village green including face painting, art and craft, general games and a bouncy castle. The sessions have been held every Tuesday morning on the village green during the school summer holidays and was well received with an average of 60 youngsters attending each week.

**LOVE WEST SUSSEX MOBILE APP** – On this West Sussex County Council mobile application, residents can report Environmental issues such as Pathway & Highways matters including overgrown footpaths, potholes, damage to street furniture or fly-tipping through their smart-phones. West Sussex County Council will process and respond using their integrated services. **SPEEDING REMINDER –** PLEASE NOTE THAT THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL ROADS IN THE VILLAGE IS 30 MPH.

**DOG NUISANCE** – One of the most frequent complaints that the Parish Council receives is the increasing problem with dog fouling within various locations of the village. There are numerous dog bins located around the village. Please 'pick up' and ensure 'poo bags' are deposited in the correct bins and not disposed of in residents' refuse/green waste wheelie bins or thrown in long grass, in trees or dropped in drains. Thank you for helping to keep Ferring clean.



#### **BE A GOOD NEIGHBOUR –**

- Hedges fronting the roadway should be cut back to allow pedestrian access along footpaths.
- Household rubbish to be kept in a suitable bin and not plastic bags.



**GARDEN WASTE –** This is the time of year when many people are carrying out pruning and other garden works which generate garden waste. Please be considerate when disposing of your garden waste. A chargeable garden waste collection service is available from the local District Council. Members of the scheme receive the use of a wheelie bin and a fortnightly collection of their garden waste. Further information can be found on the Arun District Council website.



**AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED)** – Ferring Parish Council installed an external AED a number of years ago. The unit is located at the Village Hall, on the side wall to the steps to the Club Room.

The AED is simple to operate. If a person suffers or is believed to have suffered a heart attack (cardiac arrest) the first line of action should be to call 999. The operator may ask you to administer CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) even if access to an AED is available. The caller will be guided through the steps for administering CPR.

The AED at the Village Hall is a Hyundai dual-role model for both paediatric and adult use. The unit is able to 'talk' to users (similar to a SatNav) and guide them through how to use it. It will not allow a shock to be delivered if the patient has a heartbeat, so it is safe to use.
