FUN WITH THE OUT AND ABOUT PROJECT – Due to the success of the 'out and about' project over many years, Ferring Parish Council has arranged for Freedom Leisure to return to the village with the project this summer. The project provides free weekly activities for youngsters on the village green including face painting, art and craft, general games and a bouncy castle, subject to the weather conditions. The sessions will be every Tuesday morning from 10.00 am 12 noon on Tuesday 30th July & Tuesday 6th, 13th, 20th & 27th August.



PUBLIC CONVENIENCES – Ferring Parish Council has been working closely with Arun District Council on a project to refurbish the public conveniences on the village green. The provisional start date for the works is 2nd September. Thank you to Arun District Council for their support with this project.



CLAPPERS LANE LEVEL CROSSING SAFETY CAMPAIGN – Network Rail has launched their safety campaign 'Beware of the Bubble' which reminds public of the dangers following five principles as below:

- 1. Concentrate it's easy to drift off and take more notice of your phone, music or conversation than what's going on around you.
- 2. Stop, look and listen Every crossing is different so always read the signs and follow the Instructions.
- 3. Check both ways before crossing if there is a train coming, don't cross. Stay behind the gate or fence line until the train has passed. Remember, there may be more than one train and they may be coming from different directions.
- 4. If there are any warning signs (lights, barriers, alarms) make sure you understand what they mean Always follow instructions at each level crossing completely.
- 5. Cross quickly and safely Make sure your exit route is clear and do not stop when crossing.

The Network Rail Team visited the site on 3rd May between 1.00pm – 4.00pm to raise awareness of their safety campaign.

DOG FOULING – One of the most frequent complaints that the Parish Council receives is the problem with dog fouling within various locations of the village. There are numerous dog bins located around the village. **Please 'pick up' and ensure 'poo bags' are deposited in the correct bins and not disposed of in residents' refuse/green waste wheelie bins or thrown in long grass, in trees or dropped in drains.** Thank you for helping to keep Ferring clean.



PARKING IN THE VILLAGE – Please be thoughtful and considerate when parking vehicles and refrain from parking on grass verges, pavements and obstructing wheelchair/pushchair slopes.



KEEP YOUR PROPERTY SAFE – As the weather improves, please remember to take extra care in ensuring your property is safe. Try not to leave doors open or even unlocked. Only have ground-floor windows open in the room you are in. Keep all valuables out of sight. Remember: Let the Police know if you see any suspicious behaviour.

PROPERTY SCAM (information supplied by Ferring Neighbourhood Watch Scheme) – Can your house be sold without your knowledge? In an answer YES it can.

There have been reported incidents that property owners have had their homes sold and furnishings taken without their knowledge. This is as a result of identities being stolen by fraudsters who then sell the property by searching the HM Land Registry title register to target properties that are mortgage free. To prevent this from being a possibilty, home owners can sign up to the Land Registry's free anti-fraud property alert service to receive a notification when a local authority search has been requested on your property. If you bought or mortgaged your property since 1998, your property will be registered with Land Registry. You can sign up to the Land Registry Alert Service at https://propertyalert.landregistry.gov.uk/. You will need to create an account and then follow instructions to register your property.



BE A GOOD NEIGHBOUR -

- Hedges fronting the roadway to be cut back to allow pedestrian access along footpaths.
- Household/Businesses rubbish to be kept in a suitable bin and not plastic bags.



BONFIRE SMOKE – There are no local byelaws regarding bonfires, but we ask that residents consider their neighbours before lighting a bonfire. Bonfire smoke can be very irritating and cause distress to those who are exposed to it or can be a nuisance to neighbours by preventing them from opening windows, hanging out washing, and enjoying their garden.
